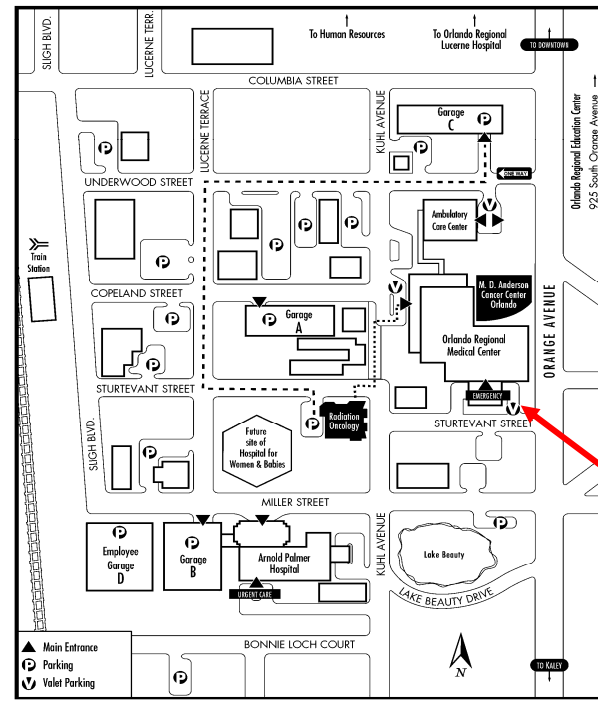
The Florida Pain Initiative
